

# 1. Our School


## 1.1 Brief History

The Government Central School was founded in 1862 at Gough Street, Central, as the first government school for boys. In 1889, it was moved to Aberdeen Street in the Central District, and its name was changed to Victoria College. In 1894, the school was renamed “Queen’s College”. After World War II, the school was re-opened at Kennedy Road. In 1950, Queen’s College was relocated to Causeway Road, its present site, and since then Queen’s College has been a whole-day secondary school for boys.

## 1.2 School Building

There are altogether 29 Classrooms, 5 Science Laboratories, 2 Computer Rooms, 3 e-learning Centers, Campus Wi-fi and Internet, 1 Lecture Room, 1 Meeting Room, 1 History Gallery, 1 Visual Arts Room, 1 Music Room, 1 Library, 1 Discipline and Counselling Room, 1 Social Worker’s Room and 1 Interview Room. The multi-purpose School Hall is on the ground floor. For recreation and outdoor activities, there are 2 Playgrounds, 1 School Garden (Morning Sun Corner), 1 Gymnasium and 1 Student Activity Centre.




School Management Committee was set up in September 1999 to implement school-based management. The composition of School Management Committee in recent years has been as follows:


## 1.5 Number of Active School Days

## **2. Areas of Major Concern: Achievements & Reflections**

### **Task 1: Promotion of Self-directed Learning**

#### **Aims**

In order to promote Self-directed Learning (SDL), students' knowledge and skills in SDL were nurtured through e-learning and extended learning activities so as to equip them for life-long learning. Teachers' professional knowledge and skills in learning and assessment design for SDL, and use of e-learning tools in SDL design and implementation were enhanced as well.

#### **Achievements**

Over the past two years, several measures have been taken to promote the skills of teachers at using the Learning Management System, including workshops, project learning, learning style workshops and the introduction of different e-learning platforms.

All subject departments were ready to implement SDL in teaching. Plans were incorporated into the teaching schemes in at least one level to promote SDL using different Learning Management Systems.

Students were exposed to learning environments outside school so as to encourage open and self-directed exploration through overseas study tours and exchange programs to Australia, Mainland China, Thailand, Canada, USA, Taiwan, Italy and Singapore.

SDL of students was also enhanced through extended learning activities related to STEM. Students joined various inter-school contests. With the guidance of teachers and their efforts in doing research, they had the chance to join International Competitions such as Odyssey of the Mind 2018 World Finals in Iowa State University, USA and 2018 World GreenMech Contest in Taiwan.

Mr. Law Wing Chung was invited to share his SDL experience in learning and working experiences with Secondary 2 and 3 students during a Life-wide Learning lesson in the first term.

Most subject departments uploaded useful websites through linkage on the school webpage to consolidate subject knowledge and promote extended learning. The school IT Team also uploaded free and useful software onto school webpage to enhance SDL.

International exposure opportunities were provided by our school to teachers, who can then bring back new and innovative teaching and learning methodologies on SDL to be shared with colleagues.

#### **Reflections**

The third year of implementing 'Promotion of Self-directed Learning' brought solid progress both among students and teachers. Subject departments, IT team, function teams, old boys and other institutes have continued to collaborate to nurture students' knowledge and skills in Self-directed Learning (SDL) through e-learning in order to make them capable life-long learners.

## **Task 2: Strengthening of Life Planning Education and Careers Guidance**

### **Aims**

The CLP Team, the Counselling Team and the Leadership Development Committee cooperated with other function teams to help QC boys with their career and life planning. Their objectives were as follows: (a) to organize Career and Life Planning programmes, (b) to organize subject-related programmes and (c) to facilitate students' personal growth and leadership development through organizing year-round extra-curricular programmes.

### **Achievements**

**Promoting Life Planning Awareness:** A "Start Your Dream" workshop was held for Secondary 1 students to help them understand their characteristics and potentials. For Secondary 2 students, a career and life planning educational drama related to students' difficulties was performed by the Hong Kong Teachers Drama Association. For Secondary 3 students, Life-wide Learning periods covered elements of life planning such as selection of electives. To help students identify the careers that their personality is best suited for, Personality and Career Assessment Tests were also arranged for junior and senior form students throughout the academic year.

**Careers and Further Education Exploration:** Careers and further education exploration helped students make informed CLP choices. CLP workplace visits were organized for Secondary 2 and 3 students to explore different careers in real settings. During the Life-wide Learning periods, they visited the Headquarters of the Electrical & Mechanical Services Department Headquarters, the Hong Kong Correctional Services Museum, the Tanner Hill Joyous Circle, the Central Police District Headquarters, the AS Production Company, the Hong Kong International Airport, and the Harbour Grand Hong Kong on 6 and 16 April 2018. Visits to university campuses and hospitals were also organized for senior form students, for example, the University of Hong Kong Li Ka Shing Faculty of Medicine and the Gleneagles Hong Kong Hospital. Students learnt more about different university programmes and the JUPAS mechanism.

To provide sufficient and updated information for students to study abroad, overseas university talks on studying in the US, the UK, Australia and Japan were held. Consultants from various education advisory bodies provided details on the benefits of studying abroad, admission requirements, scholarships and financial aid for students.

**Careers Magazines and Parents' Nights:** *Decision* and *Divination* were the two school-based Careers Magazines edited by Career Counsellors, and they were distributed to S3 and S6 students and parents. *Decision* not only aimed at providing S3 students and parents with essential and objective information regarding DSE electives choices, but also at giving first-person advice from students who are currently studying the core subjects and electives to the S3 students. *Divination* provided the latest information on JUPAS and other pathways to S6 students. Both magazines were distributed at Parents' Meetings, occasions in which parents, students and teachers freely discussed life planning. This year, a magazine, *The Road Less Travelled*, was published for senior form students to warn them about common pitfalls when making JUPAS, DSE or university choices.

**Partnership with Old Boys' Association:** The team partnered with the Queen's College Old Boys' Association to organize career and life planning programmes, making use of the professional network of old

boys to enrich students' careers-related experiences. In the QCOBA Mentorship Programme 2018, a team of mentors participated in sharing sessions with their mentees about life experiences. The old boys also provided job shadowing and internship programmes in the fields of law, property management, civil engineering and accounting for Secondary 5 and 6 students during the summer vacation. Student participants found the job shadowing and internship programmes rewarding and useful for their future careers. They had the chance to have real career experiences, which increased students' confidence in university interviews and future job seeking. There were also JUPAS mock interview sessions (including MMI Interview) and experience-sharing sessions on preparation for DSE/JUPAS and stress management conducted by senior old boys and undergraduate students.

**CLP Education for Careers Counsellors:** The Student Support Team organized an overnight inclusive education camp for S3 students. Our students teamed up with students from a special school. Through a series of group games, students learnt to accept differences. It was an amazing experience, in which they developed social and personal skills conducive to life planning.

**Electives and Careers Expos:** CLP Expos were a great way for students to receive both information and advice from professionals in different fields. A Secondary 3 Electives Workshop held by Careers Counsellors focused on different DSE elective subjects. At the Career Expos organized by the Rotary Club of Northeast, Hong Kong and the Queen's College Old Boys' Association, Secondary 4 and 5 students had the chance to hear from frontline professionals working in the fields of medicine, law, politics and communication, finance, entrepreneurship and start-up, engineering, and public administration on 29 January and 29 June 2018.

**Engagement Programmes:** Students were encouraged to participate actively in the engagement programmes organized by various institutions such as Engineering Exploration Day (HKUST), Orientation Workshop on Electronic Engineering (CUHK), PACC Forum: Accountancy, Innovation and Technology (CUHK), Hong Kong Aviation Management Programme (PolyU), The Pharmaceutical Society of Hong Kong Youth Education Scheme (HKU & CUHK), Summer School in Hong Kong - Familiarization with Veterinary Medicine (CityU), Hong Kong Special Principals' Nomination Scheme of the Young Scientist Scheme (HKU), Summer Clinical Attachment Programme (CUHK), The Undergraduate Programme Nominations Scheme (HKEdU) and A Day@Medical School organized by HKU Faculty of Medicine. They found the programmes helpful for them to make career and university choices.

**Counselling Service:** Students who had questions related to careers and further education often sought advice from Careers Masters, Class Teachers, and Careers Counsellors. Careers Teachers and Class Teachers answered students' and parents' enquiries on the days when HKDSE results were released, and on many other occasions.

**Administrative Affairs related to Further Education:** The team archived records of students' applications for DSE and JUPAS, international examinations and overseas scholarships and university applications for future reference.

**Subject-related Programmes:** In collaboration with the English Language Department, a JUPAS Personal Statement Workshop was held for Secondary 6 students. Secondary 3, 4 and 5 students read newspaper articles related to CLP values and wrote self-reflections. Students of Secondary 4 Mathematics Extended Module I & II students attended a seminar at school on "Applications of Statistics". The Liberal Studies Department

organized the workshop on learning styles for S1 students. After the workshop, they had a better understanding of their own learning styles and made improvements. Students studying Economics and Business, Accounting and Financial Studies participated in the Junior Achievement Young Entrepreneurship Project. Our school's JA company '1 Kg' designed a phone case and sold them successfully at the trade fair at Kwun Tong Promenade. Students gained hands-on experience in running a business under the mentorship of a business adviser for eight months. Moreover, a visit to the CUHK Geography and Resource Management Centre was organized by the Geography Department. Students learnt more about different geography-related jobs in the careers talk provided by the centre.

**Leadership Development of Students:** The Counselling Team facilitated CLP initiatives through active cultivation of leadership. Assembly sharing sessions on Seven Habits helped students realize that everyone's leadership potential can be unleashed as long as they take the initiative and implement their plans step by step. The S1 Orientation program helped new students understand important personal and social skills and cultivate a responsible and optimistic attitude when planning their careers and lives. S1 and S2 peer counselling programmes helped students build good qualities to become future leaders. The Leadership for Tomorrow Programme prepared S4 students for important challenges ahead in life planning, equipping them with skills and appropriate mindsets.

### **Reflections**

With the support of various function teams, the QC Old Boys' Association, the QC Parents'-Teachers' Association, external organizations and companies and tertiary education institutes, CLP programmes 2017-18 were conducted successfully.

### **Task 3: Promotion of School Ethos through 155<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration**

**155<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration of Queen's College:** The year 2017 was the 155<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Queen's College. From September 2017 to December 2017, a series of celebration events were held, namely two celebrity talks, the opening of History Corridor, a drama evening, the gala dinner and the anniversary concert. These events had been planned and implemented under proactive leadership by the 155<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration Team and the collaboration between school management, function teams, subject departments, the Parents-Teachers' Association and the Queen's College Old Boys' Association. The ultimate goal was to promote our school ethos and enhance the sense of belonging to the school among students and teachers.

**Celebrity Talks:** There were two Celebrity Talks held by distinguished scholars. The Honourable WONG Yan-lung, GBM, SC, JP shared his career experience with the students. The other talk was held by Prof. Tony Chan Fan-cheong, JP who introduced the concepts of STEM. Students benefitted greatly from their interesting sharing.

**Drama Evening:** It was the first time QC boys had performed a drama for the general public. Over two hundred people attended the performance. The school drama club performed three plays written by our old boy, Mr. YUEN Lap-fun. Mr. YUEN Lap-fun and Dr. LAM Tai-hing were guests of honour. After the performance, they stayed behind and shared their drama experience with the student performers and they benefited a lot from the dialogue.

**History Corridor:** There was strong collaboration between our History Department, students, old boys, teachers, and external organizations. Students learned a lot from processing artifacts and historical photos, and were given opportunities to develop a sense of responsibility. The History Corridor became the highlight of the Speech Day. The History Corridor will continue to serve as an asset to our school to allow visitors to understand more about QC's history.

**Anniversary Gala Dinner:** The old boys from different years and former teachers gathered with nostalgia for their school lives at Asia World-Expo. "Wonders Asunder" was the theme of the Anniversary Gala Dinner, which comprised four main sessions, namely Teaching thy Children, All thy Collegians, Cry for the Magic and Wonders in Thunder, showcasing a variety of programmes with contributions from different stakeholders. The Honorary President of QCOBA, Prof Joseph SUNG Jao-yiu, echoed the theme of the dinner by recalling lyrics of the School Song and appealed to QC boys for continued support to the alma mater. He also presented Long Service Awards to seasoned teaching staff.

**155<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Concert:** The 155<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Concert was the finale of a year-long series of Queen's College's 155<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations. We were privileged to have Professor Rocky S. TUAN as our guest of honour. It was blissful to have old boys from the community of Harmonica, String Orchestra, Wind Band, full Orchestra and Choirs to play music with our students. Among the young musicians, there were also girls and alumni from our long-term collaborative schools: Belilios Public School and St. Stephen's Girls' College. There were a selected variety of pieces, including classical symphonies, sacred choral work and an arranged popular song.

## **Reflections**

Different parties have contributed their expertise and cooperated with each other in planning and implementing the events. With the effective collaboration of different teams, departments and relevant stakeholders, the preparation and implementation of various events of the 155<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration were smooth. The aim of the "Promotion of School Ethos through 155th Anniversary Celebration" has been achieved.





### 3.3 Students' Early Exit








#### Academic Qualification




## Professional Qualifications

## 3.8 Commendations of Teachers

In 2017-18, our school joined the 23<sup>rd</sup> Teacher Commendation Scheme organized by the Committee on Respect Our Teachers Campaign: Ms. KOO Sung-en, Mr. YU Wai-keung, Ms. YUEN Ling-chun, Mr. YIP Hon-kei, Mr. LAU Yiu-man, Mr. SZETO Chin-wai, Ms. CHIU Ming-sze, Ms. NGAI Pui-wah, Ms. CHAN Yuen-mei and Ms. SIT Ka-ling, were elected by students and teachers for commendation. Ms. KOO Sung-en and Mr. YU Wai-keung were also recommended for the Award of Commendation Certificates.

## **4. Support for Student Development**

On top of facilitating students' academic pursuits, our school endeavours to foster whole-person development of students. In 2017-18, various function teams made concerted efforts to nurture our students to become valued members of our society.

The Counselling Team launched comprehensive remedial and developmental programmes to facilitate students' personal growth. The Peer Guidance Scheme was effective in creating a strong sense of brotherhood and a caring atmosphere in school. In the Scheme, Peer Counsellors and Counselling Prefects played an important role as "big brothers" of their S1 and S2 schoolmates. The S1 Orientation Day and Orientation Camp, S1 Subject Talks, S1 Orienteering Competition, S2 HIPP Camp and other inter-level activities helped the younger brothers adapt more easily to life in secondary school and develop positive beliefs and attitudes. The Counselling Team teachers also encouraged the big brothers to serve as the role models for their young brothers and develop their own characters. Moreover, the school-based Life-wide Learning Periods, Adventure-ship Partnership Programme, Training on Emotional Management, Adventure-based Counselling Training and Visit to Life Journey Centre were also effective in nurturing a respectful and responsible attitude as well as positive beliefs when facing adversity among senior form students.

The Discipline Team held three prefect training workshops for S3 and S4 prefects in September and November, 2017 and June, 2018. The workshops aimed at teaching students the importance of cooperation and strengthening team spirit among discipline prefects. It was also hoped that the prefects could develop a positive attitude towards embracing challenges in the future. In the workshops, participating prefects made good efforts to achieve the goals. In the evaluation session, a number of participants stated that they had learnt a lot about working with others and tackling complicated problems which might arise when they perform their duties.

The Moral Education Team promoted the importance of moral values to students and helped them develop proper virtues and conduct. The team organized a variety of programmes and activities in 2017-18. The Promoting Moral Values through Reading Scheme was effective in creating an atmosphere of mutual appreciation among students, helping them develop proper values and a positive attitude towards life. The Edifying Reading Scheme helped students reflect on their behaviour. Life-wide Learning periods and a number of competitions were also held to help students establish good habits and proper moral values.

To broaden our students' horizons, enhance their understanding of our motherland, and nurture their sense of global citizenship, the Civic Education Team has held a series of activities including Top Ten News Election 2017, Los Angeles Career and Cultural Study Tour, the Cultural Week, and Inter-class News and Basic Law Competitions.

The Career and Life Planning Team (CLP) issued regular publications and held a wide range of talks on subject choices, study skills and JUPAS applications for students and their parents so as to help students make informed choices for their future. There were also workshops on writing university application statements and briefing sessions on overseas studies and scholarship applications. CLP workplace visits were organized for Secondary 2 and 3 students to explore different careers in real settings. On 29 January and 29 June 2018,

the team organized Career Expos with the Rotary Club of Northeast Hong Kong and Queen's College Old Boys' Association for senior form students. Old boys also provided job shadowing and internship programmes in the fields of law, accounting, civil engineering and property management for Secondary 5 and 6 students during the summer vacation. Furthermore, through the Mentorship Programme, the team hoped to help students broaden their perspectives, develop their potential and achieve their academic and career aspirations. Before and after the DSE results were released, a series of individual and group counselling sessions on further education opportunities were provided to S6 students and their parents.

Financed by the Beat Drugs Fund, the Health and Sex Education Team has been implementing the Healthy School Programme with a focus on discouraging drug use since 2011. The team continued to work with the Tung Wah Group of Hospitals CROSS Centre to organize a range of activities, together with our school-based programmes, to help students think positively, establish healthy lifestyles and develop positive values.

The Student Support Team continued to provide individual support to students with special educational needs (SEN). The School-based Educational Psychologist visited our school twice a month to conduct assessments of SEN cases, hold meetings with students, teachers and parents and offer advice on enhancing learning and teaching of SEN students. The SEN Teaching Assistant offered intensive everyday assistance to students with special physical or emotional needs. A series of individual or group intervention programmes for students with Autism and Attention Deficit Disorders were conducted by Educational Psychologists or Behavioral Consultants. With the Learning Support Grant for Secondary Schools provided by the EDB, programmes were implemented to promote inclusive education.

To enhance students' environmental awareness, the following activities were held in 2017-18: City Tracing (Co-organized with St. Paul's Co-educational College), a talk by Dr. Li Lok Sze, No Air-conditioner Night, Earth Hour, Beach Cleaning (Lei Yue Mun), red packets recycling, visit to Eco-Park, visit to T-Park, two wetland field studies for Specific badges in Ting Kok, watching the film "The Amazon" at the Space Museum, VR Experiential learning in Food Angel, Life-wide learning lesson, Green Photos competition, Green Life Slogan Competition, Cartridge Recycling Scheme by Canon, I-Veggie workshop, sharing in Morning Assemblies, training workshops, seminars, and Inter-Class Waste Paper Competition. Apart from these, our school joined the Student Environmental Protection Ambassador Scheme 2017-18 organized by the Education Bureau and the Environmental Protection Department, in which 20 Student Environmental Protection Ambassadors won Merit Awards and 20 students were awarded 'Basic Environmental Badge' and 8 students were awarded 'Specific Environmental Badge'. Three students were granted the "Outstanding Student Environmental Protection Ambassadors Awards", earning Gold and Silver Prizes. We also received great support from parents. Over 76% and 83.3% families agreed to join the 'No Air Conditioner Night' and 'Earth Hour' respectively. In short, the school year 2017-18 was fruitful and saw active participation from students and parents in environmental protection.


Aiming at fully exploring and developing the potentials of gifted students, the Gifted Education Team provided students with opportunities to receive education appropriate to their levels. In 2017-18, the Mathematics Department joined the Giftedness Into Flourishing Talent project offered by CUHK. In the project, our students applied the concept of Self-directed Learning and developed their higher-order thinking. Students not only developed their creativity, but also applied their knowledge in their daily lives. Moreover, the Team organized various training programmes including QC Mathematics Olympiad and QC Physics Olympiad. In

addition, gifted students were invited to receive training to explore their thinking skills and creativity. Our school made contact with local tertiary institutes and provided regular programmes to our students, such as an airship-making workshop. Furthermore, to enhance our students’ academic knowledge and practical skills, our school joined different competitions such as Gifted Angels — Services Learning Project 2017-18, 2018 Odyssey of the Mind World Finals and 2018 World GreenMech Contest.

The Leadership Development Team offered a range of activities for our students in 2017-18. In the adventure based Leadership Training Camp held in October, 2017, all (144) S4 students and 12 S5 leaders (Discipline and Counselling core prefects) were able to develop problem-solving abilities and teamwork through completing various tasks. The team also collaborated with the Counselling Team and held the S.1 Orienteering Competition in November 2017, in which all (144) S1 students, 47 S4 and S5 Counselling Prefects participated. The winning team of the competition further participated in the Eldpathy activity later in December 2017. In another collaboration with the Counselling Team in November 2017, 27 S4 and S5 Counselling Prefects were enrolled in the Adventure Ship Partnership Programme. In the programme, the prefects cooperated with mentally handicapped persons to complete tasks on a ship and developed their counselling and leadership skills. Moreover, 30 S2 students attended the 7-Habits Workshop, and 15 S4 and S5 students completed the negotiation and mediation workshop. In the Queen’s College – Diocesan Girls’ School exchange programme held in March 2018, 12 S4 students from each school participated in various activities including attending formal lessons and a leadership workshop. These activities were beneficial to the participants’ personal development and thus they were able to make a positive impact on their peers.



### 5.1 Destination of exit students




## 5.2 Results of Hong Kong Attainment Test (Pre-S1)


### CHINESE (Pre-S1)




