Annual General Meeting

The 36th Annual General Meeting of the QCPTA was held at the school hall on 18 October 2024. Six parents were elected to join the Executive Committee with six incumbent parents and seven teachers. Major Activities Organised by the QCPTA in 2024-2025

To promote and develop a healthy lifestyle, family bonding, as well as strong connection between the school and the parents, the QCPTA has organised a series of events and activities. Below are the highlights.

Parent Volunteers and Social Service Team Appointment Kick-off Ceremony

QCPTA comprises two service teams: the volunteer team and the social service team. The volunteer team mainly assists the association in organizing on-campus activities, while the social service team mainly serves the community and makes contributions to society.

The "Parent Volunteers and Social Service Team Appointment Kick-off Ceremony" was held on the evening of 10 December 2024. The Appointment Ceremony was kicked-off by our Chairperson, Ms CHAN Hoi-Yan Christina. We successfully recruited about 80 parents joined the volunteer team and 139 to join the social service team for the school year 2024-2025. Valuable opinions and comments were collected during group discussions, which will help guide our future activities.

Parents-Also-Appreciate-Teachers Drive

In order to promote parents' respect and understanding of teachers' work, and emphasize the important role of teachers in children's education, QCPTA has continually supported this campaign this year. We hope to create a positive educational environment to enhance students' learning outcomes. Through gratitude, respect, and support, parents and teachers work together to create a better future for education and lay a solid foundation for children's growth.

Lantern Festival Glutinous Rice Balls Reunion

The "Love Our Home, Treasure Our Country 3.0" Lantern Festival Workshop, themed "Reunion with Tangyuan," took place during lunch on 7 February 2025. It was co-organized by the National Security Education Group and QCPTA. On that day, teachers, students, and parents came together to learn the art of crafting panda shaped tangyuan, savor delicious tangyuan, and solve lantern riddles.

Walk with You on Subject Select

The QCPTA collaborated with the Careers and Life-Planning Team to hold an information day on subject selection exclusively for S3 parents on 15 February 2025. Many parents signed up and attended the talk with their sons. A total of more than 100 parents attended the talk. Senior form students shared in-depth information about the subjects and generously shared their insights into studying. Parents received valuable knowledge on each elective subject.

The Parent-Child Sha Tau Kok One-day Tour

Our outing this year, the Parent-Child Sha Tau Kok one-day tour, took place on 22 February 2025. It was attended by about 60 participants, including non-Chinese-speaking families.

This event allowed everyone to relax, fostered communication among parents, and provided a delightful experience for the children. Thanks to all the parents for their support, which made this event a success!

Blood Donation Day

The Blood Donation Day was successfully held on 26 February 2025 at the school hall. Nineteen parents successfully donated blood. This event was supported by the professional nursing staff from the Hong Kong Red Cross Blood Transfusion Service Center, who provided comprehensive services. We would like to express our gratitude to the parents for their participation in such a meaningful event, and to the school, teachers, and students for their support.

Sharing with Parents of Applicants for Secondary One Discretionary Places

The interview day for students applying for Secondary One discretionary places of the school was held on 8 March 2025. In order to help parents gain a deeper understanding of our school, the QCPTA held a parent sharing session.

We invited two former Vice Chairpersons, Mr Vincent LEUNG and Ms Venus HO, along with guest Mr Terence LAU, as well as current committee members and parent volunteers. They shared stories about their children's learning and growth, patiently answering various questions from the parents. We also played highlights of our activities, allowing parents to truly experience the spirit of "home-school cooperation", reassuring parents that their children would lead a fruitful school life. The sharing session was lively and the parents responded enthusiastically.

School Open Day

Queen's College Open Day, themed "Aeternus", was held on 28 to 29 March 2025.

"Aeternus" symbolizes the enduring brotherhood among alumni and their profound connection to the alma mater.

The QCPTA set up a booth in the school hall and provided five types of souvenirs, including:

- Eco-totes featuring calligraphy by alumnus Dr TSUI Pui-Chee
- Luggage straps & tags engraved with QC's core values
- Multi-functional lanyards & pouches in school tie colors
- Denim pencil cases with classic school crest

With the help of more than 100 volunteers, the souvenirs were sold with good results.

The QCPTA also organised a "Legacy · Imprint" stamping postcard workshop, showcasing 2,000-year-old multicolor printing techniques from the Western Han Dynasty. This allowed participants to create unique keepsakes while experiencing traditional craftsmanship. The workshop attracted visitors of different ages, including children, parents, and the elderly.

Parent Academy

We organized the first Parents Academy seminar, titled “Pastel Nagomi Art Workshop”, on 15 April 2025. More than 30 parents participated in the workshop, including parents of non-Chinese-speaking students. Parents were able to relieve stress through creating Pastel Nagomi art. Under the experienced tutor’s gentle guidance, parents created their own unique drawings, focusing on self-expression. Parents thoroughly enjoyed the artistic journey.

The second seminar, a thematic talk titled “Safeguard Children’s Mental Health”, was conducted by Ms CHAN Man-Yee and took place on 24 May 2025 at the school hall. Many parents took time to attend the talk. Ms CHAN provided a wealth of information about the characteristics of changes in adolescents, shared her own experiences, and provided many practical tips for parents on how to get along with their children. We believe that the participants also benefited a lot from this session. Those who attended one or more seminars and completed the evaluation and self-reflection will be awarded Graduation Certificates.

Overseas Studies Parents Talk

The “Overseas Study Online Parents Talk” co-organised by the QCPTA and Careers and Life-Planning Team of the school was held on 4 May 2025. Graduates from Mainland China, the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, and Australia were invited to share their study experience. The disciplines shared involve physiotherapy, chemistry, pharmaceutical chemistry, sociology, economics, science and design in architecture. Over 200 parents signed up for this event.

Newsletters and Website
